

Stewardship Thought: The one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. – 2 Corinthians 9:6. As we sow bountifully through these offerings, we look in faith toward a bountiful return – not in terms of dollars & cents, but in satisfaction & fulfillment for supporting the greatest cause on earth.

Gospel Connection: On a cold evening in New York last winter, a commuter had just gotten off his train and was hurrying to walk the few blocks to his apartment - and the hot drink he would make for himself as soon as got home. As he rounded the corner to his street he heard a young girl's voice cry out: "Get your hot chocolate here, hot chocolate here!" And just ahead of him was a table with a large thermos of hot cocoa, a can of whipped cream, miniature marshmallows and a stack of plastic cups. The commuter was impressed - a different take on the summer lemonade stand. As he approached the table, the delightful seven-year-old proprietor asked if he preferred whipped cream or marshmallows. Placing his order, he took out his wallet and asked how much she was charging. "Oh, it's free," she laughed. The confused commuter looked at the girl's mother, who was standing nearby. "You're giving it away?" "Yes, it's free," her Mom said with a smile. "My daughter got so many gifts for the holidays, we wanted her to learn to give back to the community, and we thought this might be a good way. So enjoy." [*The New York Times*, February 3, 2014.]

The parable of the sower speaks especially to parents: that Mom and Dad's own example of selflessness and humility, of compassion and generosity, are "seeds" that are planted in the mind and heart of their children that will mature one day into their own harvest of generosity and forgiveness. Christ calls us to model the sower of today's Gospel within our own homes and households: to sow seeds of encouragement, joy and reconciliation in the earth of our own "gardens" and doing the patient work of realizing the harvest he has promised, to trust and believe that our simplest acts of kindness and forgiveness, our humblest offers of help and affirmation may be the "seed" that recreates and transforms our homes and hearts.
