**Stewardship Thought:** Some of us have received much, and some of us have received little, and most of us are somewhere in between. Help us, Lord, to give in proportion to what we have received.



**Gospel Connection:** Every Friday afternoon a very wise teacher asks her fifth grade class to take out a piece of paper and write down the names of four children they would like to sit with the following week. The children all know that these requests may or may not be honored. She also asks the children to nominate one student who they believed had been an "exceptional classroom citizen" that week. All ballots are submitted to her privately. And every Friday, after the students leave for the weekend, she takes out the slips of paper, places them in front of her, and studies them. She looks for patterns: Who is not getting requested by anyone else? Who can't think of anyone to request? Who never gets noticed enough to be nominated? Who had a million friends last week and none this week? The teacher is not looking for a new seating chart or "exceptional citizens." She is looking for lonely children, for children who are struggling to connect with other children, for the little ones who are falling through the cracks of the class' social life. She is discovering whose gifts are going unnoticed by their peers. And she is pinning down - immediately - who is being bullied and who is doing the bullying. Her Friday lists are an X-ray of her classroom to see beneath the surface of things and into the hearts of her students. She started doing this every Friday since the shootings at Columbine 15 years ago. Every single Friday since Columbine she looks at this "picture" of the students entrusted to her - because she understand that all violence begins with disconnection, that all outward violence is rooted in inner loneliness. Being a math teacher, she understands that everything - even love, even belonging - has a pattern to it. She finds the patterns in her Friday surveys and through those lists she breaks the codes of disconnection. Then she gets the lonely kids the help they need. [Glennon Doyle Melton, momastery.com]

We tend to see people as either "good" or "bad" and take it upon ourselves to "separate" and pull up the "weeds" from our lives. But this gifted fifth-grade teacher understands that only God can separate the good from the bad - and that everyone is both "wheat" and "weed." She seeks instead to bring out and nurture the "good" that she knows exists in every one of her students. Discipleship recognizes that we all possess the ability to do compassionate and good things out of love and, at the same time, there exists within us that impulse to selfishness and fear that controls our actions and thought processes. May we possess the wisdom and generosity of heart to harvest the "wheat" that grows in our midst despite the "weeds" that sometimes choke us all.
