

Stewardship Thought: May each offering given be a sacrifice that honors you. Thank you for giving us this opportunity to glorify you with our finances. May we hold all of our gifts with an open hand of generosity in faith that you will never stop providing what we need.

Gospel Connection: After God created the heavens and the earth over six days and rested on the seventh, God look around and

found that everything was good - maybe too good, he realized. So, on the eighth day, it is said, God created one of the greatest of divine gifts: rust. Without some kind of rust, the world would be a cosmic junk pile of stuff that would never decay, never change, never cease to exist. Not only physical stuff, but mental stuff. Stuff like anger, resentment, disappointment. Stuff like sin. Every time we pray we ask God to remember us and take care of us. But at the same time, we ask God to "forget" our sins. And, strangely, God promises to do both. Divine rust sets in and God forgets, so the story goes. God-made rust enables us to forget, as well. Over time, old angers and arguments corrode in the oxidation of forgiveness; painful encounters and embarrassing moments disintegrate in the fresh air of reconciliation. Oh, sometimes we fight the rust and cling to those hurts and refuse to forgive and move beyond them - and all we have as a result it just a growing pile of pain. But God's gift of rust enables change and newness - what our spirits and souls desperately need to live life to the full. Let God's rust do its work. Real love is impossible without such spiritual "rust," rust that enables us to forget and let the hurts and injustices inflicted on us and that we inflict on others - corrode. In all his parables on forgiveness and reconciliation, Jesus calls anyone and everyone who would be his disciples to be committed to the work of reconciliation, to be always ready and willing to make the first move toward forgiveness, to be actively engaged in the work of creating community. Forgiveness is not easy: it means overcoming our own anger and outrage at the injustice waged against us and focusing our concern, instead, on the person who wronged us and ruptured our relationship with him/her; it means possessing the humility to face the hurt we have inflicted on others as a result of our insensitivity and self-centeredness. Life is too fleeting and precious to allow hatred and vengeance to destroy our lives in needless recriminations, pointless anger and stifling guilt. Christ calls us to create a sense of community in which forgiveness is joyfully offered and humbly but confidently sought - all because of God's gift of spiritual "rust."
