**Gospel Connection:** The basketball coach was walking by the locker room after practice. What he heard sent him into a rage: two of his players, seniors, were taunting a freshman player. Their cruel bullying crossed the line into ugly racism. The coach threw open the door to the locker room - and everything immediately stopped. The two players knew immediately that they were in trouble. The coach, seething but keeping control, said to the two, "I want you here at eight tomorrow morning. No excuses." Promptly at eight the next morning, the two players were waiting at the front door of the gym. The coach pulled up in his car. "Get in," he ordered. In absolute silence, they drove to a small, rundown building that housed a grammar school in the heart of the city. "Gentlemen," he said, "a friend of mine teaches here and coaches their team in the city grammar school league. I offered your services this morning to run a clinic for his team."

The two players got out and slowly walked to the playground in the rear of the building. There they were greeted by the teacher and his

The two players got out and slowly walked to the playground in the rear of the building. There they were greeted by the teacher and his team of fifteen nine and ten-year-olds. The kids were Asian, Latino, black, and a host of different nationalities. "I really appreciate your coming to help us out," the teacher said, extending his hand to the two. Clearly their coach had not told him what had taken place the evening before. The two "star" players spent the next two hours putting the kids through drills, showing them how to line up their shots, going over defensive stands. The kids had a ball - what they lacked in skill they more than made up for in attentiveness and enthusiasm. The two high school players were gods to them. At the end of the morning, the two received hugs and smiles and high-fives from their young charges. "This was great! Thanks for coming," the teacher said. "My kids learned a lot. Your coach should be really proud of you."
They smiled, glad that the kids had a great time. But they had learned much, much more. [Adapted from *Tell It Slant: A Conversation on the Language of Jesus in His Stories and Prayers* by Eugene Peterson.]

The high school players learn the lesson of Jesus' parable: that before God, we are anything but "gods." Before God, we stand as brothers and sisters; before God, the distinctions of class and culture that separate us disappear; before God, we are loved without condition and limit. The coach challenges his two players to see their world in a different light: as a community that is centered in the holiness of God that dwells within every man, woman and child; a community that sees deeper than the externals of race, nationality, culture and language in order to behold the love of God animating the lives of all who draw breath; a community that reflects the compassion and mercy of God in our care of one another. To belong to and build such a community is central to the call of the disciple to build the Kingdom of God in our own time and place.
