Gospel Connection: A mom was working hard to make this Christmas "perfect" - after a less-than-perfect year: She and her husband separated, leaving her responsible for the children and their small farm in Maryland. She was feeling bitter, abandoned and exhausted from trying to make it all work. On Christmas Eve, the kids were working on last-minute projects and getting ready for church. She realized that the animals had not been fed yet, so she pulled off her heels and stuffed herself - still in her dress and pearls - into heavy-duty zippered coveralls. She put on her muddy barn boots, warm gloves and ski cap and headed outside. In the clear, night air she headed to the barn. And she began filling the troughs for the two Hereford steers, the gray Appaloosa mare, the rust-colored quarter horse; she climbed into the loft and broke apart a bale of hay; she then cracked the ice in the water trough. Soon the animals were enjoying their Christmas dinner. In the quiet dark of the barn, she could hear the slow crunch-crunch of the steers and horses munching their grain and flutter of pigeons hopping around for stray kernels of grain. The stamping of feet, swishing of tails and low throaty moos made a kind of music in the crisp night air. The rich scents of loamy earth, grain and hay flooded her nostrils. What a wonderful place this barn is, she thought. Is that why you chose to be born in a barn, O God? Away from the hustle and bustle, surrounded only by the simple creatures of the earth? Away from the worries of the world? She was filled with wonder and awe; her pain and anger and rejection melted; she felt in that barn a peace that had eluded her for a long time. She remembers of that moment: "I leaned against the rough timber of the door post for a long time, drawing in that feeling of being cared for, of being absolutely loved. I drew it in as hungrily as the animals devoured their feed . . . No, perhaps the glad tidings of that first Christmas in Bethlehem were not expressed in a pretty dinner table laid with fine china, a beautifully decorated house or a candlelight church service, or in anything else I could do. The good news was in the overpowering reality of Christ's birth, and the love that lit our darkness like the brightest star. On that Christmas Eve, he came to a barn once again, just to remind me of that love." [From "A Moment in the Barn" by Nancy McGuirk, Guideposts, December 2005.]
