Gospel Connection: Between the two of them, they worked three full-time jobs. The college tuition costs for their son and daughter are astronomical. But their love for their children and their hopes for their futures make their sacrifices more than bearable - almost a joy. *Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a single grain*...

As a teenager, she suffered from anorexia. Her eating disorder almost killed her, but thanks to a loving and patient family and her own hard work, she conquered her guilt and shame brought on by her distorted approach to food and her negative image of herself. Today she is in her twenties, with daughters of her own, leading a happy lifestyle and following a healthy, realistic diet. She is also part of a support system for other teenagers suffering through the same anxieties and fears she experienced - and overcame . . . but if the grain dies, it bears much fruit.

The most important lessons he learned in law school weren't in the classroom or from a casebook but in the legal clinic in a lowincome neighborhood in the city. During his last year of law school he spent two afternoons a week at the clinic helping the poor, the elderly, and the non-English speaking work out problems with landlords, tax matters, immigration issues, and the myriad of legal entanglements and questions that can overwhelm those on the edge of society. His work at the clinic taught him why he wanted to be a lawyer: to obtain justice for the exploited, to be a voice to the powerless, to secure the rights of those who are invisible to the world. While many of his fellow law students were ready to sell their souls to become associates at big, prestigious firms, he found his soul in legal aid work. *Those who love their lives will lose them, but those who hate their lives in this world will keep them for eternity.*

In dying to our own needs and wants, we bring the new life of Christ's resurrection into the lives of others - and into our own lives, as well. The Gospel of the grain of wheat is Christ's assurance to us of the great things we can do and the powerful miracles we can work by letting go of our prejudices, fears and ambitions in order to imitate the compassion of the crucified Jesus.
