**Stewardship Thought:** Lord, we use this time now to lay

palms and garments before you. We praise and acknowledge your

salvation in our lives with gifts of thanksgiving.

Gospel Connection: It's one of the most vicious, hateful statements in all of Scripture: "Crucify him!" As we say it in our communal reading of Mark's passion, we can't help but feel a disturbing sadness. They are painful words to hear and say. From our distance two thousand years away from the event, we realize the injustice of those words. We know the greed and hatred that led the crowds to shout them. What crime could Jesus have possibly committed to warrant such a death? But we have our own variations of "Crucify him": You couldn't possibly understand . . . She's not one of us . . . He's not worth it . . . Why should I care? That's your problem . . . Tough! That's the way it is. Nobody likes you, you know . . . And then there are the cruel epithets and vile insults that we barely keep to ourselves, that we might voice when triggered by uncontrollable rage or too much alcohol. The words of the crowd in the passion story haunt us, to be sure. But we have our own versions of that hateful call.

In the events of this Holy Week, in the passion and death of his beloved, God is rejected and humiliated, suffers and dies - just as every human being experiences. But God allows himself to be broken in order that we might understand the fragile, impermanent nature of this life. As we will see as the Gospel unfolds, the brokenness we both suffer and inflict can be healed in the love God - love that is humble, love that is sincere, love that is centered in gratitude and selflessness. In the broken body of Jesus, we are reconciled with God; in the broken body of Jesus, our lives are transformed in the perfect love of Christ; in the broken body of Jesus, God's Spirit of humility and compassion becomes a force of hope and re-creation in our hurting and desperate world.

Everyone is welcome – married, widowed or widower. This is a social event to get a chance to visit with each other and celebrate marriage. Entertainment will be provided.
