**Stewardship Thought:** We call upon the Lord to receive our gifts of tithes and offerings. Lord, we give to you in sincere imitation of your generous gifts to us.



**Gospel Connection:** Every Sunday, the villagers on a small Pacific island gather for prayer. On Sundays when the priest could not come for Mass, prayer leaders prepare for their day's services, readers are sought, and everyone sings. Unfortunately, impaired eyesight is a common problem due to the islanders' limited diets and the intense glare of the sun. The lack of electrical lighting in the simple church does not help either. One Sunday a woman named Marguerite was the prayer leader. Her husband, Anjua, was one the readers. When Anjua stood to read, he reached over to Marguerite to borrow her glasses. When he finished, his brother Airmail, who was to read next, borrowed the glasses from Anjua. Then Airmail returned the glasses to Marguerite for the remainder of the service. The pair of glasses, shared among the community, spoke as powerfully of God's love in their midst as the words of their prayer. [Janet Hockman, M.M., *Maryknoll*, November/December 2014.]
