Gospel Connection: In one family, it is a Good Friday. A job has been lost, a career derailed. A serious illness has been diagnosed. A relationship has unraveled. But the other members of the family put aside their own lives and come together at the foot of their loved one's cross. Their love moves whatever mountain necessary, changes the course of whatever river is in their way. Together, Mom and Dad and sister and brother bear one another's crosses to bring hope, healing, forgiveness - and resurrection - to their life as a family. The love of our families transforms every tragic and desperate Good Friday into Easter.

In this classroom late one afternoon, it is a Good Friday. The numbers and diagrams in the algebra text are a mystery to the high school junior. She is frustrated and intimidated and wants to quit. A tired, overworked teacher just wants to go home after a long week; but, seeing her student's frustration, she takes off her coat, puts down her pile of books and papers, and patiently walks through the problems with her discouraged student. After a lot of hard work and patience, the "lights come on." A teacher's selfless caring and generous gift of time transforms this student's Good Friday into Easter.

In the wake of a devastating storm, it is a Good Friday. A village has been leveled; a town has been isolated; a city has been shut down. But good folks from all over come to rescue the lost, care for the hurting and dispossessed, repair and replace damaged and destroyed systems. Church groups and service organizations rally donations and supplies to get the suffering and afflicted beyond this catastrophic Good Friday to the Easter restoration of their homes and community.

We sometimes find ourselves struck in a Good Friday world: our problems batter us, overwhelm us, strain our ability to cope and make it all work. Our *Alleluias* are tempered by reality; we approach this Easter Day with "Christ is risen, BUT . . . " But in raising his Son from the dead, God vindicates the Gospel of his Christ: that good conquers evil, that love turns hatred, that light shatters the darkness. Our lives are filled with experiences of resurrection, when the despair and desperation of our Good Fridays are transformed into Easter hope by the compassion and mercy of those who have embraced the good news of Easter morning's empty tomb.
