

Stewardship Thought: Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. Heavenly Father, thank you for giving us this opportunity to cheerfully share our resources with your kingdom here on earth.



Gospel Connection: When Ben Simon and Mia Zavalij were students at the University of Maryland, they began to notice that their school was wasting a lot of food: they found that one College Park dining hall was throwing out almost 200 pounds of leftovers every day - this in a city, Washington, D.C., where one in eight people were struggling with hunger. So Ben and Mia organized a group of their friends to collect the leftover food each evening and bring it to local churches and food banks. One of the churches they donated to was able to feed hundreds of people each month just from what Ben and Mia and their friends brought in. Shortly after Ben and Mia began their food runs, they started the Food Recovery Network. Every evening, student volunteers at colleges around the country show up at their school's dining hall. The cafeteria staff cart out the day's leftovers. The food is weighed and packaged and the students then take the food to local food banks and churches for distribution. Since its beginning four years ago, the Food Recovery Network has grown from Ben and Mia and a few of their friends in Maryland to 140 chapters in 35 states. The students have recovered more than 800,000 pounds of food from American colleges and universities. Thousands of poor and hungry families are fed from the leftovers these students collect every day.

We can learn a lot from leftovers. After feeding the crowds with the scraps of bread and fish, Jesus asks his disciples to gather up the leftovers. As the twelve wicker baskets of leftovers attested to the sign Jesus had worked, our own baskets of "leftovers" and fragments are signs of the many blessings we have received in our lives. Today's Gospel also challenges us to realize the many things we waste in our lives that can be the difference between life and death for our brothers and sisters, that our stored "wicker baskets" of clothing, food, household goods, toys and, yes, money, can become signs of the providence of God in our midst.
