

Gospel Connection: In his book *Nine Essential Things I've Learned About Life*, Rabbi Harold S. Kushner recounts a sermon he gave one year at Yom Kippur on the subject of forgiveness. He suggested that just as we ask God to forgive what we might have done wrong in the past and can't be perfect, so we should forgive the people who have hurt us or offended us because they, too, are only human. The day after Yom Kippur, a member of the congregation came to the rabbi's office. She was very upset as a result of the sermon. She told him how her husband had left her several years ago for a younger woman and how, as a result, she had to work two jobs to pay the bills and put food on the table, and has had to explain to her children why they can't have the things that all their friends have. "And you want me to forgive him for what he has done to us?" The rabbi told her, "That's right. I want you to forgive him. Not to excuse him, not to say that what he did was acceptable. It sounds like it was a very selfish thing he did. But I want you to forgive him for your sake, not for his. Why are you giving him the power to define you as a victim? Why are you giving him the power to define you as a victim? Why are you giving him the power to define you in terms of what you don't have, a husband and an adequate income, instead of what you do have, a warm and loving home and two beautiful children? Do you realize what you are doing? For six years, you've been holding a hot coal in your hand, looking for an opportunity to throw it at him. And for six years, he's been living comfortably with his new wife [and] you've burned your hand. Think of it this way: If he is no longer living in your house, why are you letting him live rent-free in your head? He doesn't deserve that. He doesn't deserve the energy you waste on being angry at him. You can evict him anytime you choose to. You can take away his power to push your buttons and make you feel sorry for yourself."

Anger that "possesses" us, obsession with punishing those who hurt us, self-pity and fear that paralyze us are the "unclean spirits" that displace the things of God in our lives. Only in a spirit of gratitude for the blessings of our lives rather than being driven by our hurts and disappointments can we "exorcise" the "Legion" of demons that rob us of hope, of joy, of peace; only in embracing the Jesus' demanding and humbling spirit of reconciliation and mercy can we rise from the "tombs" we have dug for ourselves and make our lives new and whole in the love of God.
