**Gospel Connection:** One afternoon a week she carves out a couple of hours in her already packed schedule to head to the clinic operated out of a downtown church hall. There she and a team of volunteer nurses give flu shots, treat any number of injuries, make referrals and dispense not only medical help to the poor and elderly, but compassion and caring - clad in the "camel hair" of nursing scrubs.

He's part of a group that spends Saturdays at the little track house his parish is rehabbing. The church got the building for a song from the city and plan to use it as a safe house for families in crisis. A tool belt is the "leather belt" around his waist.

Parishioners keep a freezer in the church basement stocked with food. Anyone going through a hard time because of illness, emergency or an unexpected job loss can contact the church office and they'll be in touch with supper and anything else they need - "locusts and wild honey" in the form of casseroles and apple pies.

In the spirit of John the Baptizer, "prophets" make crooked roads straight and rocky paths level by their compassionate generosity and humble giving. In our Advent care, we "proclaim" (the Greek word for "prophet") the presence of God in our midst in our simple and ordinary acts of compassion, mercy and justice. Putting on our own versions of "camel hair" and strapping on our own "belts" of "leather," may we be about the work of proclaiming and building the Kingdom of God; in the offering of our own "locusts and wild honey," may we be signs of God's presence in this Advent of our lives.

**Religious Education:** All classes will meet on Wednesday, December 7<sup>th</sup>. All classes begin at 7 pm. There will be the opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation for Grades 3 – 6 and 11 during this class. Grades 7 – 10 will have confession on December 14<sup>th</sup>. First Reconciliation for Second Grade will be held at St. Anne's on Saturday, December 10<sup>th</sup>.

St. Nicholas Day: Feast Day, December 6: Nicholas (280-343) came from a wealthy family, with parents who always were generous to the poor. When they died, Nicholas gave their money away to help people in need. He became a priest and was soon made a bishop. He was known for caring for children in trouble, healing the sick, and feeding the hungry. He often performed secret acts of kindness. After he died, stories of his goodness spread to many countries. He became known as Nicholas the Wonderworker. Tradition holds that kids who leave their shoes by the door before they go to sleep will wake up with their shoes filled with candy and small treats – Saint Nicholas has been there!

**Advent Meditations**: This is a time of year when patience yields to frustration, fulfillment turns to greed, and enough simply becomes not enough. In these days of excess, we wonder how we can ever change our understanding of God's provision—for us, our families, friends and strangers alike. Where is the justice in it all? It is in this season of want that we encounter a reading from the Book of Isaiah (Isaiah 11:1-10) on this second Sunday of Advent. Because our God is a God of justice, we too are a people of justice, and inequality will not rule our land. The poor will live with the rich, the adult will learn from the child, and God's provision will be enough. We light this candle today to provide a reminder that even a small flame is enough to cast light all around it—assurance that our work for justice can speak with the voice of God.
