**Gospel Connection**: An American visitor stopped by the home of one of his friends in Tanzania. As he entered the house, the visitor could hear all sorts of excited chatter and animated laughter coming from the living room. The visitor's friend and three guests were playing Scrabble. The four were really into the game. The visitor asked who was winning. They replied that they didn't know because they weren't keeping score. In fact, they were helping each other when needed, sharing and exchanging letter tiles. They even allowed a dictionary to be used. *What?* The visitor asked. *What about the rules?* The players explained that they weren't interested in individual scores. The whole idea was for the four of them to beat the total combined scores of their previous games. They weren't playing for individual honors but for community gain. What they wanted was to get the maximum points from the letters they had to the greatest extent possible. This everyone-wins Scrabble game is the ideal of Jesus' "commandment" to his disciples gathered at table with him the night before he died. The love that Christ "commands" of us finds its source in the heart and spirit, not in whatever "rules" we establish, not in our own "winning" - especially when our winning means that another "loses." Loving as Christ has loved us begins by putting aside our own hopes and wants to realize, instead, the hopes and wants of others; by caring for and about others with humility and understanding, regardless of the sacrifice demanded of us; by readily making the first move to forgive and to heal, no matter how undeserving. May we realize the powerful sense of resurrection we can bring about by embracing the spirit of Christ's love in our attitudes and relationships.

**Crowning of Mary:** During the Month of May -- a month both named for and dedicated to Mary -- Catholics have long honored her by placing a crown on her image. The tradition in the United States and many other countries has been for school children to have a "May Crowning" ceremony, with a procession of students, pretty dresses and a wreath of flowers that one child gets to place on the statue. Any students or children are invited to participate in our Crowning procession! We will be doing this at our Masses on May 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>.



**Cemetery Project:** The Cemetery Committee has recommended an update to the Cross area in the cemetery. The split face granite is falling off and the statues are about ready to crumble. *This project will be starting in the next week or two, as the ground is drying out enough to begin*. We will replace the existing cement with exposed aggregate. Also we will be adding granite ledgers with sandblasted pictures on it to replace the angels. The cost of the project is estimated at around \$25,000. This is an enormous project for cemetery. It is important to the committee to maintain a safe and beautiful cemetery.
