Connections: A Vietnamese woodcutter is returning home after a long day working in the dense tropical forest. He comes across the remains of a soldier — an American. Time removed any traces of identity or personal effects long ago. With respect for life and the honor and dignity afforded to all human beings that is central to his Buddhist faith, the woodcutter carefully and respectfully buries the body. The moment is captured in a poem from the Vietnamese poet, Tran Thi My Nhung:

Was your plane on fire, or did you die of bullet wounds, or fall down exhausted?

Just so, you died in the forest alone.

Only the two of us, a woodcutter and his wife, dug this grave for you, burned joss sticks, prayed for you to rest in peace.

How could we know there would be such a meeting between you and I, once separated by an ocean, by the color of our sky, by language?

But destiny bound our lives together.

And today, by destiny's grace, you are finally going home.

I believe your American sky is as blue as the sky above this country where you have rested for twenty years.

Is it too late to love each other?

Between us now, the ocean seems so small. How close are our two continents in this moment.

I wish a tranquil heaven for your soul, gemmed with twinkling stars and shining moon.

May your soil rest forever in the soil of your home.

Tips for Praying at Home: These were posted from the Diocese of Sioux Falls.

- Create a prayer altar under your TV or streaming device. Consider setting a crucifix or other sacred art in the prayer space.
- Open your bible to the gospel of the day and place it on your "home alter" to remind you that the Word of God is among you.
- Light a candle to symbolize the beautiful light that shines in the darkness and to help your home resemble the Church.
- Set up chairs like a pew to help you engage in the mass and keep you from passively watching from the couch.
- Get dressed as you normally would when attending mass. Keeping this routine is especially helpful for children.
- If you have holy water at home, bless yourself and your family before you begin the mass.
- Take a few moments of silence to transition from the busyness of your home to the sacredness of the mass.
- Fully participate by sitting and responding according to the rubrics of the mass.
- Engage in community by having coffee and breakfast with your family after mass or by calling your loved ones to connect.

Where to find the TV Mass: You can find the Mass from the St. Cloud Diocese from their website (stcdio.com – way at the bottom of the home page you will find a list of "Resources" and the TV Mass is there). You can also find it on the app for your device – see the front of the bulletin. There are also other options! Relevant radio is streaming the Mass from their chapel at noon each day. Locally, you can find it at 1330 AM from the Cities or listen online at relevantradio.com. If you have a cable service, you can watch the EWTN. Channels for each company are: Midco – Channel 73, Mediacom – Channel 094, Dish – Channel 261, DirecTV – Channel 370. There are a multitude of websites that have a Mass as well.
