Churches slowly re-opening! We have submitted our plan to Bishop Kettler and are waiting for his approval of the plan to reopen Church to public Masses. Once we receive approval, we will have just one weekend Mass on Sunday. The time will be determined by what happens at the next ACC meeting on Monday, May 18th. There will be a list of changes that we will need to implement for us to comply with the Bishop's guidelines. Here are some of the changes and/or additional things you will see:

- * Pews will be marked where you can sit in family groups. Ushers will seat you.
- * There will be hand sanitizer you will be asked to use before & after Mass
- * There will be no missellettes for the time being
- * There will be no Mass Servers or Extraordinary Ministers
- * Ushers will tell you when to go to communion or leave the Church
- * The Church will be sanitized after Mass
- * Weekday Masses will still be held in the basement
- * We ask that you practice social distancing when entering, leaving, and during communion procession
- * We ask that you not gather at the back of Church after Mass

Once we have been approved, more information will be posted. Brenda will also send out an email to those parishioners that have an email address with details.

Connections: On *The New York Times'* Parenting website, a dad tells of transforming his son's terror into possibility:

"When my five-year-old son told me there might be monsters in his closet, I grabbed a jar from the kitchen, and the little net from his fish tank, and said, 'I hope we can catch one!' After I made a big show of searching and came up empty-handed, he consoled me. Since we turned that fear into a game, not only was he not afraid of closet-monsters, he was sorry there weren't any."

The Advocate that Jesus promises his disciples in today's Gospel is the grace and wisdom to take on the "monsters in our closets": self-centeredness, bigotry, violence, avarice. The Advocate is the Spirit of God that brings us together as a Church, the people of God, to take on those monsters, helping us to see that together, following the example of Jesus, we can transform those monsters of hate into opportunities for hope. The Risen Christ's promise of the Advocate is a mixed blessing: God's Spirit can be "scary," threatening our lives and lifestyles, confronting us with our irresponsibility and culpability — but that Spirit opens our hearts and consciences to hear the voice of God in the noise and tumult around us, enabling God's presence transform our "monsters" into the justice, forgiveness and peace of the Easter promise.

Tips for Praying at Home: These were posted from the Diocese of Sioux Falls.

- Create a prayer altar under your TV or streaming device. Consider setting a crucifix or other sacred art in the prayer space.
- Open your bible to the gospel of the day and place it on your "home alter" to remind you that the Word of God is among you.
- Light a candle to symbolize the beautiful light that shines in the darkness and to help your home resemble the Church.
- Set up chairs like a pew to help you engage in the mass and keep you from passively watching from the couch.
- Get dressed as you normally would when attending mass. Keeping this routine is especially helpful for children.
- If you have holy water at home, bless yourself and your family before you begin the mass.
- Take a few moments of silence to transition from the busyness of your home to the sacredness of the mass.
- Fully participate by sitting and responding according to the rubrics of the mass.
- Engage in community by having coffee and breakfast with your family after Mass or by calling your loved ones to connect.
