Gospel Connection: In an essay in the *National Catholic Reporter* [January 2014], the late writer and poet Brian Doyle lamented a “sin” he committed that had a sobering and lasting effect on him. His ten-year-old son had been fighting with his brother for what seemed like an eternity. Dad’s demands that he cool it were met with either indifference or snark. Finally, Dad had had enough.

“I roared at my son, I grabbed him by the shirt collar, I frightened him so badly that he cowered and wept, and when he turned to run, I grabbed him by the arm so roughly that he flinched, and it was that flicker of fear and pain across his face, the bright, eager, holy-riveting face I have loved for ten years, that stopped me then and haunts me [still] for I am the father of his fear, I sent it snarling into his heart, and I can never get it out now, which torments me.”

As soon as Brian let go of his arm, the boy “sprinted away and slammed the door and flew off the porch and down the street, and I stood there simmering in shame. Then I walked down the hill into the laurel thicket as dense and silent as the dawn of the world and found him there huddled and sobbing. We sat in the moist, green dark for a long time, not saying anything, the branches burly and patient. Finally, I asked quietly for his forgiveness and he asked for mine and we walked out of the woods, hand-in-hand, changed men.”

Most of our struggles to forgive are the stumbles we make in hurting those we love most. In the same awkward situation, we can be both the aggrieved father whose discipline is more than justified and the self-centered son who hurts deeply the ones who love him the most. As Brian Doyle learned in his encounter with his son, we all possess the grace to forgive; the love of God empowers us to seek forgiveness and make right what our selfishness has broken or shattered.

Religious Education: The calendar for this year’s RE classes has been mailed this Thursday. Please watch for it in the mail. Classes will begin on Wednesday, October 2nd with the first class in the Parish House. There will not be a “First Mass” this year, due to Father will be out of town for a couple of days that week. Area Catholic Community Meeting: Members of our Area Catholic Communities (hereafter ACC) met on Tuesday, August 20th at St. Wendelin’s Mary Hall. A warm welcome to Fr. Matthew Crane (newly assigned to St. Mary Help of Christian Parish) in absentia. Fr. Crane was unable to attend due to his installation Mass at St. Mary Help of Christian.

As it currently stands, our ACC will be shepherded by our current pastors. There is no plan to change Mass times. It is possible that the three pastors may rotate among the parishes for weekend Masses. Discussion did take place regarding a possible Mass schedule, in the event our ACC had only two priests. There was a good discussion and agreement that St. Mary Help of Christian would have two weekend Masses and the other parishes one weekend Mass. No future Mass times were established and remember, no change in Mass times are expected currently.

Fruitful discussion followed on Faith Formation and Youth Ministry. The council saw this as an area where we could collaborate, since St. Mary Help of Christian is looking at hiring a Faith Formation Director and possibly a Youth Minister. One idea which surfaced is to hire a degreed person in Religious Education for the ACC. This person would develop a program to deepen the faith life of children, youth, and adults. This person would seek volunteers and stipend persons to work in our various parishes. A similar model could be used for Youth Ministry.

Next steps in regard to Faith Formation and Youth Ministry:

- *Present idea to Parish Councils for approval
- *Have Finance Councils determine what funds are available in their budget.
- *Create a Task Force to study options and create job descriptions.

The next meeting is set for September 26, 7pm, at St. Anne’s in Kimball
